

BRM V16 piston clock

- 1) Q: How much is the clock?
A: The clock costs £6000 (six thousand pounds) inclusive of VAT and delivery to a UK address. If wanting delivery overseas then additional delivery costs will be confirmed to you before your order is dispatched and must be paid before dispatch takes place.
- 2) Q: When do I need to pay for my clock?
A: A non-refundable deposit of £1500 is required when ordering a clock. The balance must be paid before the clock is dispatched to you.
- 3) Q: How can I pay the deposit/balance?
A: We accept most major credit and debit cards. Payment can also be made by cheque made payable to The National Motor Museum Trust.
- 4) Q: How many clocks are there?
A: There will be 14 clocks.
- 5) Q: Will they all be released for sale at the same time?
A: No, originally just six clocks will be released at £6000. If you are unsuccessful in your initial application you will be given first opportunity, along with other unsuccessful applicants, to order a clock from subsequent releases. Clocks will be allocated on a 'first come first served' basis.
- 6) Q: When do the clocks go on sale?
A: The initial release for sale will be made on 19th May 2018 at the Beaulieu Spring Autojumble.
- 7) Q: How can I apply for a clock?
A: You must complete an order form. Order forms can be obtained on the [National Motor Museum Trust website](#) or by emailing BRMClock@beaulieu.co.uk or by contacting our main shop on 01590 614639.
- 8) Q: What is the clock made out of?
A: The historic pistons and their connecting rods originate from the BRM's supercharged V16 engine, which made it famous during its heyday driven by motorsport aces Juan Manuel Fangio and Reg Parnell as one of the most advanced racing cars of its time. They will be mounted on a wooden base and will have brass fitments.
- 9) Q: How big is the clock?
A: The following dimensions are approximate:
Height in total 24cm
Width at bottom of base 9.5cm
Diameter of clock face 4cm



- 10) Q: When will the clock be delivered?
A: Given the unique nature of this timepiece and the crafting of the pieces required to bring about its creation it is, at this time, difficult to predict the completion date for this project. However, whilst the delivery date of the piece is not guaranteed The National Motor Museum Trust and its suppliers will endeavor to deliver the piece by 31st December 2018. However, the contract you will enter if wishing to buy one of these pieces is one where time is not of the essence.
- 11) Q: Will the pieces be numbered?
A: Yes each piece will be uniquely numbered.
- 12) Q: Can I request a particular numbered piece?
A: Pieces will only be allocated on a random basis and as such we will not guarantee the number of the piece you will receive.
